

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

- Set aside funding for a new animal control facility to replace the 50+ year old out of compliance embarrassment we currently use.
- Purchased 5 new Police cruisers to keep the fleet up to date and safe.
- Established the first ever organized Montville police department to take effect July 1, 2023
- Purchased new Air packs and turn-out gear for our firefighters.
- New SCBA washer to remove cancer causing agents to keep firemen safe.
- Purchased new Class A uniforms for the police
- Purchased Class A uniforms for paid firefighters never had in 20 years.
- Cleaned up fire training grounds removed old bus.
- Approved lease purchase of new Fire engine to replace 20-year-old truck.
- Funded refurbishment of Oakdale Tanker to last another 15 years.
- Approved \$350k to start transitioning to the state radio system. The current system is antiquated and unsafe.
- New backup generator for the Oakdale Fire House
- Purchased new weapons for the PD to replace older and now proven unsafe Sig Saur with Glocks.
- \$32k for police radios and tazers
- Obtaining 2 new Narcotics K-9 for the Police Department



#### **EDUCATION**

- Purchased an additional 5 new school buses and a van to be added to the 6 buses we approved 4 years ago thus bringing our fleet up to date. No more 30-year-old buses.
- Hired 2 additional police officers to be School Resource officers for the safety of our students as well as arm the current school guards.
- Awarded the schools money for the security grant. The BOE now had approx. \$165k to do security upgrades.
- Had an \$8 million bond approved for the school's upgrades including new tennis courts.
- Funded capital improvements for the schools, only the second time in past 20 years.
- New backup generator for the Bus garage
- Van for BOE maintenance staff
- Approved Narcan training and put Narcan in all the schools
- Installation of new carpet at Tyl Middle School



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- Provide a van for use by Youth services who have been asking for 12 years
- Continue to sell off town owned properties restoring them to the tax rolls and lessening our liabilities.
- We now Recognize Juneteenth as an official Town Holiday as does the State and Federal Government.
- We are no longer listed as a distressed community.
- Passed a level funded budget during the worst economic times and high inflation,
  Reduced Democrats proposed 3 mil increase to 1 mil this year
- Replaced housing authority members and started an investigation into corruption, arrest made.
- Purchased a new vehicle for public works & P&R
- Gave \$16k to MYFL for helmets and gear
- Hired a full Time Human Resource Associate
- Continue to pave roads across Town as part of the \$10 million dollar bond we started.
- Approved and funded a new state of the art fishing pier and upgraded boat launch off dock road.
- Upgraded the free section at the transfer station.
- New Inclusive Playground at Fair Oaks
- New tennis/pickle ball courts on Simpson lane
- Turned over 3 roads to the tribe, has been in the process for years. Received \$100k for capital improvements from tribe.
- Provided a new walk-in cooler and freezer for the senior center along with a backup generator.

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- Refurbished the old Town Hall, now Social Services building. Windows, Paint, A/C, Carpets
- Currently working to upgrade the Dance room at Fair Oaks with more space and a new floor.
- Upgrading Desjardins Park
- Fixed narrow Bridge on Moxley Road, currently
- Purchased 2 new mowers and a dump body for public works
- Funded a new maintenance garage at Camp Oakdale for PW
- ADA compliant sidewalk for new tennis courts
- \$10k for farmers market advertising
- Summer concert series every Thursday free to residents
- Extra money for Raymond Hill library operating fund and including funding for renovations and A/C installation
- \$20k for Montville Lacrosse team
- \$10k to replace computers at senior center.
- \$30k for housing authority to upgrade bathrooms for the disabled.
- \$15k for senior mental health counseling
- Upgrading the tennis court bathrooms that have been closed for almost 20 years.
- New I pads for youth services
- \$14k to senior center virtual classes
- \$20k for senior's bus trips
- \$10k for senior programs
- Incentivized the adopt a road program to pay non-profits to pick up trash
- Used Nip Fund money to hire summer help to pick up trash.
- Allowed for a waiver to fill vehicles at the transfer station.
- Distributed 2300 free Covid tests to the public
- Installation of a new electronic sign located at the Town Hall to distribute public information.
- Upgraded to LED lighting at Camp Oakdale
- Repaired basketball courts at Camp Oakdale
- Upgraded Desjardins Park
- Stopped the purchase of a \$100,000 charging trailer that was previously approved under democratic control. This frivolous spending would allow people a central location for charging phones; however these options are already readily available in power outages throughout the town at fire stations with generators or with a simple car charger.
